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INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of equity and fixed income securities. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the composite benchmark, 50% Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) and 50% return of the 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill, net of tax

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Balanced Fund is suitable for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon at least five (5) years

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Interest Rate Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of domestic fixed income securities due to a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/ events that may lead to a rise interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/ events and/ or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

Equity Price Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of stocks listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange, which may be brought about by adverse stock market conditions, unfavorable company earnings and valuations and/ or negative developments in domestic and global political and economic conditions.

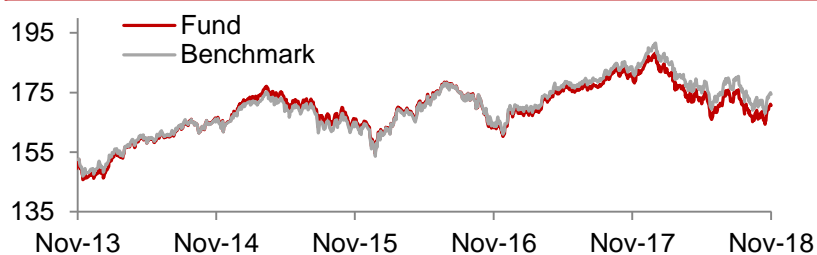

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The local equities market bounced back as renewed interest on Emerging Markets re-emerged. The PSEi rose by 3.19% month-on-month to 7,367.85. The rally was supported by heavy volume with Average Daily Turnover registering at US\$212 million.

In terms of macro-economic news, there were a couple of significant events that transpired over the course of the month. 3Q GDP came out at 6.1%, the slowest for the year. It was driven by private consumption (+5.2%) though slowed down a bit coupled with the increase in government consumption (+14.3%). Second is the surprise monetary action by the Bangko Sentral in which they raised the policy rates by another 25 bps to 4.75%. The total rate hikes made by the BSP is 175 bps in the past six months of 2018. Third is the conclusion of the 3Q corporate earnings where the average growth for PSEi names is at a modest 7%.

Foreign selling in the Philippines has started to abate significantly. Net foreign flows came out positive at US\$702 million but this was bloated by the RRHI-Rustans retail block and EDC tender offer block. Excluding these, net foreign selling came down to US\$99 million.

Top index gainers for the month include GTCAP (+16.84%), BPI (+14.42%), and MBT (+13.81%). Meanwhile, worst performing index names were TEL (-16.69%), SCC (-6.26%), and AP (-5.93%).

Top gainers for the month include DMC, +12.83%; MER, +8.18%; and JFC, +7.39%. Meanwhile, detractors were JGS, -12.33%; URC, -10.03%; and PGOLD, -9.89%. Year-to-date, SMC, +53.23%; MER, +11.93%; and GLO, +10%, were the leaders while SECB, -42.56%; GTCAP, -39.12%; and AEV, -36.49%, declined the most.

Fund Performance. The fund rose 1.67% in November, underperforming its benchmark by 6 basis points. Year-to-date, it underperformed the benchmark by 144 basis point with a return of -7.13%.

Fund Strategy. Given the recent run-up in PSE, we look to increase our equities exposure at any point of market weakness. In terms of style, we retain our preference in banks, consumer and selected large cap names.

- (b) Primarily medium term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investment outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow.
- (c) Primarily medium term tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund.
- (d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
