INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of equity and fixed income securities. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the composite benchmark, 50% Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) and 50% return of the 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill, net of tax

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Invest Balanced Fund is suitable for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon at least five (5) years

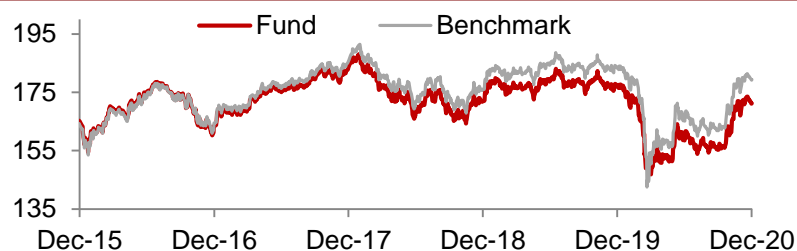

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) climbed in December as vaccine developments spurred optimism in the market. Domestic liquidity was able to keep the market afloat despite the continued foreign selling. The bellweather index marched up by 5.1% to close the year 2020 at 7,139.71. Lackluster volume was apparent for the period, with average daily turnover at US\$196 million or -25.2% month-on-month. In terms for foreign flows, the last month capped the year of net foreign selling, with December registering US\$171 million. For the year 2020, the total net foreign selling was US\$2.5 billion.

Macro-economic news for the month are as follows: 1) Inflation rose to 3.3% in November as a result of higher food inflation (fish, fruits, vegetables etc) due to weather-related supply disruptions. Moreover, prices of alcoholic beverages and tobacco also accelerated. 2) The balance of payment position posted a surplus for November at US\$1.47billion or 172% year-on-year. 3) The country's gross international reserves (GIR) level, increased by US\$706 million month-on-month to US\$104.5 billion as of end-November. The GIR is equivalent to 11.2 months' worth of imports.

In terms of individual stock performance, the main advancers include: RLC (+27.6%), AEV (+12%), JGS (+9.06%) while the detractors are BLOOM (-8.9%), RRHI (-4.41%) and PGOLD (-2.73%).

In the local economic space, November inflation came in at 3.3% year-on-year, significantly higher than the 2.6% median market projection and rising from October's 2.5% figure. Food inflation continued to spike, driven by supply constraints due to the effects of typhoons and flooding, while rising alcohol and tobacco prices also contributed to the increase in inflation. Nevertheless, risk sentiment was strong in December, as optimism surrounding developments in the COVID19 vaccine and the passage of local fiscal support measures and the signing of the 2021 national budget into law buoyed risk asset prices. Amidst a perceived stabilization in the local pandemic situation and in light of the significant monetary support already extended over the year, as well as the uptick in inflation, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) held its policy rate steady in its last meeting of the year. BSP Governor Benjamin Diokno stated that the central bank would keep its rates accommodative for the next two years, highlighting the need for economic growth and unemployment to revert to pre-pandemic levels before considering tightening policy.

Fund Performance. The fund returned 2.49% in December, underperforming its benchmark by 11 basis points. Year-to-date, it underperformed the benchmark by 113 basis points with a return of -3.42%.

Fund Strategy. We look to stay invested in domestic equities given the low global interest rates and risk-on sentiment. We will also continue buying on dips and adhere to large cap quality cyclicals ahead of big foreign funds positioning slowly.

For the fixed income portion of the fund, we continue to favor the safety of time deposits and short term securities. Expectations of continued accommodative monetary policy may depress rates in the near term.

- (a) Shares of Stock of selected corporations which are already listed or being offered publicly and soon to be listed in major capital markets.
- (b) Primarily medium term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investment outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow.
- (c) Primarily medium term tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund.
- (d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
