INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a Fund-of-Funds, intends to achieve for its Participants principal protection by investing in a diversified portfolio of primarily domestic money market and bond collective investment schemes. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the BPI Philippine Government Bond Index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Fixed Income Portfolio Fund-of-Funds is suitable only for investors who:

- Are classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon of more than five (5) years.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Interest Rate Risk: The Fund invests in an long term portfolio of domestic government and corporate securities, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/ events that may lead to a rise interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/ events and/ or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the Fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors.

Credit/Default Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the failure of the borrower/ debt issuer to make timely interest and/ or principal payments on its deposit liabilities, loans, bonds or other debt instruments due to a deterioration in the borrower's/ issuer's financial condition or external factors and events that may affect its ability to repay financial obligations such as negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

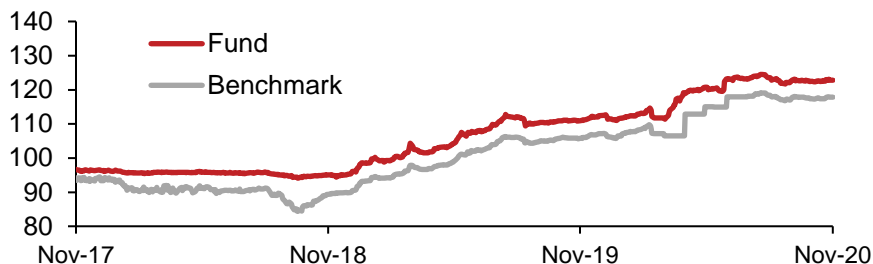

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The BPI Government Bond Index returned 0.43% in November, with benchmark government yields declining 8 basis points (bps) on average. The yield curve bull steepened, with yields in the short end of the curve declining with greater magnitude than the decline in longer-term. Daily trading volume averaged PHP17.4bn, rising from October's PHP14.6bn, with the 4.8-year RTB5-13 and 5-year FXTN10-60 securities seeing the highest volumes over the month.

The Bureau of the Treasury (BTr) held two FXTN auctions in November, with PHP30bn on offer for each. The first was a reissuance of the 3-year security FXTN 3-25 (first issued in September 2020); the second was a reissuance of the 5-year security FXTN10-60 (first issued in 2015). Both reissuances saw healthy demand and were fully awarded; the 3-year security saw total bids of PHP64.4bn and was awarded at an average yield of 2.224%, 4 bps higher than the average yield it was awarded at in its last reissuance in October. Meanwhile, the 5-year security saw bids totaling PHP66.0bn, and was awarded at an average yield of 2.900%, 12 bps higher than the average yield it was awarded at in its October reissuance.

In the local economic space, October inflation came in at 2.5% year-on-year, slightly higher than the 2.4% median market projection. Food inflation due to supply constraints (particularly pork) was the main inflationary driver, with most other components of the inflation basket steady month-on-month. Mid-month, Philippine third-quarter GDP came in at negative 11.5% year-on-year, significantly lower than the median estimate of negative 9.6%, with pandemic-related declines in industry, services, and consumption spending, as well as typhoon-related damage, driving the lower growth figure. With national government agencies highlighting downside risks to their full-year growth forecasts, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas unexpectedly cut policy rates by 25 bps in its mid-November meeting, emphasizing the need to support economic growth in response to typhoon-related damage and continuing pandemic-related drags.

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 0.22% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 21 bps.

Fund Strategy. The fund looks to maintain its underweight duration position relative to the BPI Government Bond on the back of additional supply for 2021-2022 as the government expands its budget and targets a larger budget deficit to fund pandemic response; low bond yields will rise as growth picks up.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Primarily in more than one collective investment schemes, that are approved/registered and supervised by the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (the "BSP") or the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") and managed by the Trustee or by its related parties; provided further that such combined investment in collective investment schemes should not fall below ninety percent (90%) of the net asset value of the Fund.
- b) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- c) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- d) Bank deposits, BSP special deposit account or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- e) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
