INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a Fund-of-Funds, intends to achieve for its Participants principal protection by investing in a diversified portfolio of primarily domestic money market and bond collective investment schemes. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the BPI Philippine Government Bond Index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Fixed Income Portfolio Fund-of-Funds is suitable only for investors who:

- Are classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon of more than five (5) years.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Interest Rate Risk: The Fund invests in an long term portfolio of domestic government and corporate securities, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/ events that may lead to a rise interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/ events and/ or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the Fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors.

Credit/Default Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the failure of the borrower/ debt issuer to make timely interest and/ or principal payments on its deposit liabilities, loans, bonds or other debt instruments due to a deterioration in the borrower's/ issuer's financial condition or external factors and events that may affect its ability to repay financial obligations such as negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

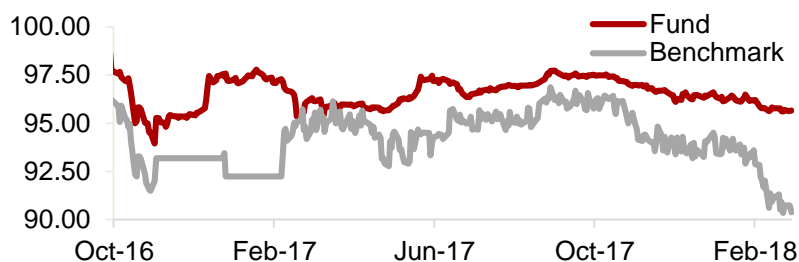

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has transactions and outstanding investments including deposits, investment in the share/s of stocks, and/or debt issuances of the following companies related to BPI Asset Management and Trust Corporation (BPI AMTC):

Odyssey Peso Medium Term Bond Fund, a fund managed by BPI Asset Management and Trust Group – PHP 1.767 Million

BPI Money Market Fund, a fund managed by BPI Asset Management and Trust Group – PHP 1.188 Million

Investments in the said outlets were approved by BPI AMTC's Board of Directors. Likewise, all related party transactions are conducted on an arm's length and best execution basis and within established limits.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The BPI Government Bond Index fell by 3.07% in February as yields climbed by an average of 69 basis points across the curve. The rise was seen across all tenors with the short-end, belly and long-end of the curve rising by 86, 68 and 47 basis points, respectively. Compared to the month of January, peso-denominated government bonds were much less actively traded with an average daily volume of Php7.5 billion. Trades were mostly seen on the liquid securities such as the recently-issued 5-year RTB5-11, the 14-year 20-17, and the shorter-tenored 3-year RTB 3-8.

The Bureau of the Treasury's two FXTN auctions during the month saw somewhat tepid demand as investors looked to trim positions amid expectations of rising interest rates globally. The first was a new 7-year FXTN issuance, which was fully rejected by the BTR. The auction was oversubscribed with total bids amounting to Php25.8 billion relative to the Php20 billion auction size. Had it been awarded, the average yield on the 7-year paper would have been at 5.273% compared to the 4.390% awarded during the last successful 7-year auction on October 18, 2017. Bids for the auction rose as investors reacted to the higher-than-expected January inflation print released earlier that morning.

The second auction, a new issuance of a 20-year paper (FXTN20-22), was partially awarded at an average yield of 6.414%, with a coupon of 6.5%. Only Php8.85 billion out of the Php20 billion initial offer was accepted. Bids amounted to Php22.766 billion. The average yield was 137 basis points higher than the last successful 20-year bond auction (FXTN20-21), causing market players to sell off on the long end of the curve.

On the local front, inflation for the month of January hit 4%, the highest level in three years. The increase in consumer prices was largely due to the recently implemented Tax Reform for Acceleration and Inclusion (TRAIN) law. While still within the BSP's targeted range of 2-4% for the year, the higher-than-anticipated CPI print sparked a sell-off in the local fixed income space as market players mulled over the possibility of quicker rate hikes from the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

In a meeting concluded last February 15, the BSP announced a cut in the country's Reserve Requirement Ratio (RRR) from 20% to 19% effective March 2, 2018. BSP Governor Espenilla noted, however, that an RRR cut should not be taken as a shift in their monetary policy stance. A cut in the RRR implies increased liquidity in the financial system, which could help support economic activity and capital market development over the medium term.

Fund Performance. The Fund lost 0.55% in February, outperforming the benchmark by 252 bps.

Fund Strategy. The Fund looks to reduce its duration position given expectations of rising interest rates moving forward. Volatility may persist in the global space, and the portfolio will be actively managed to take advantage of this. Investors in a bond fund must be prepared to withstand volatility as higher investment value is typically achieved over the medium to long term.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Primarily in more than one collective investment schemes, that are approved/registered and supervised by the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (the "BSP") or the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") and managed by the Trustee or by its related parties; provided further that such combined investment in collective investment schemes should not fall below ninety percent (90%) of the net asset value of the Fund.
- b) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- c) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- d) Bank deposits, BSP special deposit account or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- e) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
