INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund intends to achieve for its participants capital appreciation and income derived from a diversified mix of preferred stocks and fixed income securities primarily issued by Philippine corporations. The Fund aims to provide returns in excess of the return of the BPI Philippine Corporate Bond Index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

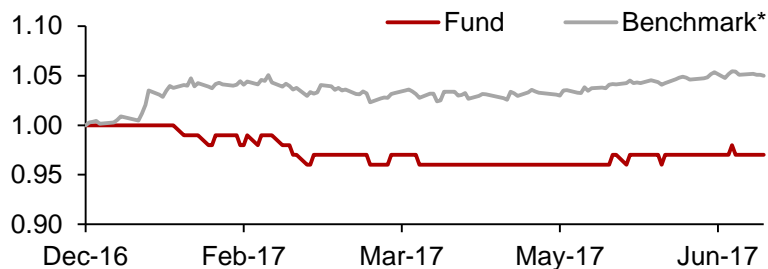

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The BPI Government Bond Index rose by 1.26% in June, mainly driven by the decrease in yields in the longer end of the curve. Compared to the month of May, peso-denominated government bonds were more actively traded with an average daily volume of Php13.93 Bn. Trades were mostly seen on the liquid securities such as the 3-year RTB 3-8, 8-year FXTN 10-60, and 6-year FXTN 7-58.

Healthy demand was seen during the two FXTN re-issuances held by the Bureau of the Treasury (BTr) in June. The first auction was the bFXTN 10-61, which was awarded at an average yield of 4.692%, lower than its primary issuance at 4.75%. With the total bids amounting to Php29.491 billion, the government fully awarded the 15 billion offer of the 10-year paper. Similarly, the re-issuance of the FXTN 20-21 saw the average yields went down to 5.035% compared to last month's primary issuance at 5.25%. The fully awarded auction of the 20-year paper showed a healthy turnout being twice oversubscribed.

Given that trust institutions were required to exit the BSP's Overnight Deposit Facility (ODF) and Term Deposit Facility (TDF) by end-June, both the 7-day and 28-day TDF auction last June 28 remained undersubscribed. Although the accepted yields on the 28-day tenor remained high ranging from 3.40% to 3.50%, accepted yields on the 7-day tenor went down ranging from 2.99% to 3.35%.

The local inflation print came in at 3.1% in May, slower than previous month's 3.4%. Though the BSP kept rates on hold during its monetary policy meeting last June 22, it cut its 2017 inflation forecast to 3.1% from 3.4%. Globally, US Federal Reserve (FED) Chair Janet Yellen reiterated that the FED would continue to tighten gradually as expected by the market. On the other hand, European Central Bank (ECB) President Mario spoke "strengthening and broadening recovery in the Euro-zone" while reiterating that stimulus was still necessary.

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 0.00% in June, underperforming the benchmark by 63 basis points.

Fund Strategy. We remain neutral on equities and continue to take profits as we overshoot the 8,100 level (at 19.5x P/E). We'll continue to be opportunistic on strong market flows focusing on undervalued conglomerates and companies that might potentially be positive surprises come 2Q earnings season.

- a) Primarily tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by Philippine corporations; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; investment outlets/ categories the BSP allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if quoted two-way prices are readily available and regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- b) Primarily tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund or any such instrument as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X 410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- c) Shares of preferred stock of selected corporations which are already listed or being offered publicly and soon to be listed in the Philippine stock market.
- d) Bank deposits or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- e) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
