### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund intends to achieve for its Participants liquidity and stable income derived from a diversified portfolio of foreign currency-denominated short-term fixed income instruments. The Fund aims to provide absolute returns in excess of the return of the 3-month U.S. Treasury Bill. The Fund was approved to be converted to a U.S. Dollar-denominated money market fund last March 6, 2015. \* It has likewise been renamed to the BPI U.S. Dollar Short Term Fund last June 1, 2015.

### CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust / Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI U.S. Dollar Short Term Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- Are at least classified as moderately conservative based on their risk profile.
- Have an investment horizon of up to one (1) year.

### KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

<b>Interest Rate Risk:</b>	The fund invests in short term foreign currency denominated fixed income securities, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/ events that may lead to a rise interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/ events and/ or negative developments in political and economic conditions of countries where the securities are issued/ traded.
<b>Liquidity Risk:</b>	Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors.

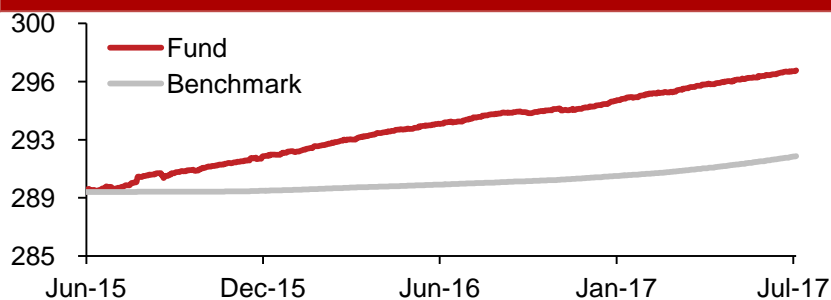

## OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

**Market Review.** The JP Morgan Asia Credit Index (JACI) Philippines gained 0.46% in July even as Philippine dollar-denominated bond yields moved higher across the yield curve by an average of 0.41 basis points, mostly on the short-end of the curve. Yields on the medium-tenored RoPs maturing 2024, 2030 and 2032, however, fell by an average of 6.5bps. Despite the market volatility seen earlier during the month, bond prices were well-supported in July as investors digested dovishness from US Fed Chair Janet Yellen during her testimony to Congress, coupled with mostly disappointing US consumer-related economic data. Meetings held by three of the major central banks globally added to the dovish sentiment as both the Bank of Japan and the European Central Bank signaled to markets that the era of ultra-easy monetary policy would continue for the time being. Meanwhile, the Federal Open Market Committee continued to assure markets of a gradual pace of rate hikes while simultaneously mentioning that it might soon begin to unwind its massive balance sheet. US Treasury gains made from the earlier dovish comments were thus somewhat capped by the implications of a Fed balance sheet wind-down. As a result, the US 10-year Treasury benchmark yield ended the month at the 2.2960% level. Local inflation for the month of June eased to a five-month low of 2.7%, slower than the 3.1% registered in May. The slowdown was in line with market expectations and still within the BSP's targeted range of 2-4% for 2017. Data released during the month showed that the Philippine government's infrastructure spending posted a yearly increase of 11.4% in June, which brought the 2Q17 infrastructure spending to a 5.9% YoY growth. While the growth figure was higher than that of 1Q17's, the government must spend roughly Php312 billion more to meet the 2017 target of Php550 billion (3.5% of GDP). Manageable inflation and continued robust economic growth should allow the BSP to keep its policy rates accommodative.

**Fund Performance.** The Fund rose by 0.10% in July, beating the benchmark by 1 basis point.

**Fund Strategy.** The Fund will maintain its duration of less than 1 and will continuously look into corporate bonds for yield enhancement.

## LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- (b) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- (c) The principal investments of the Fund will be in money market instruments denominated in, but are not limited to, the following major currencies: U.S. Dollar, Euro, British Pound, Canadian Dollar, Australian Dollar, Swiss Franc, Danish Kroner, and Japanese Yen.
- (d) Bank deposits, BSP special deposit account or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- (e) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
