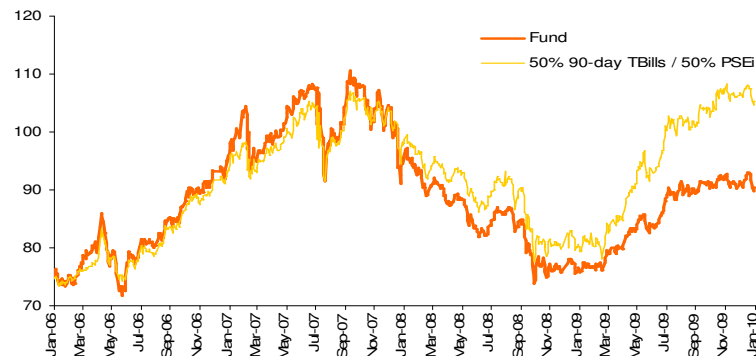

Fund Manager's Report

Philippine shares declined 3.3% this month, breaching the 3,000 PSE index level, as risk aversion resurfaced following a proposal to limit proprietary trading among US banks and news on monetary tightening in China. Weak economic numbers on US jobs and housing markets further dampened investor sentiment, prompting investors to sell riskier assets. All sectors, except services, were down between 2% to 8% as local market players decided to lock in gains from last year's run up. Foreign players were net buyers for three consecutive months now, favoring defensive names such as utilities and telecommunication stocks. Cyclical stocks, which include banks and property names, were out of favor and were hardest hit this month following its strong performance in 2009. Average daily market turnover declined by 30% to PHP 2.7 Billion as market players turned cautious on equities given the uninspiring macroeconomic newsflows.

In the near-term, we see further consolidation in local share prices as investors await for fourth quarter earnings releases and as the political noise intensifies going into the May elections. We maintain our bias towards defensive names as market volatility increases, though we remain on the look-out for undervalued cyclical stocks that may already be at attractive price levels.

Net Asset Value Per Unit

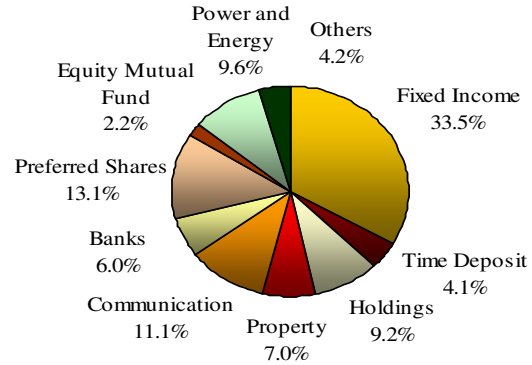
