The Fund aims to provide excess return over the composite benchmark, 50% Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) and 50% return of the 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill, net of tax

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) ended the month of February slightly lower by 0.25% to 6,671.04. The confluence of global and local developments continued to stir volatility. On the global side, erratic oil prices, speculation on the US Dollar and the Chinese Yuan, and global financial concerns have all affected market sentiment. Meanwhile, on the domestic front, the corporate earnings results have mostly been less than impressive. This was highlighted by the big miss in PLDT where the company reported a core income of Php35.2 billion, which was 6% lower year-on-year. But what really shook investors was PLDT's core profit guidance of 20% lower for 20162017. Average daily value traded daily trading volume amounted to Php6.03 billion or 4.87% higher month-on-month.

Foreigners continued to be net sellers during the month of February, will with a net outflow position of USD84 million. This marks as the eleventh straight month of foreign outflows.

Top index gainers for the month are were PCOR (+39.23%), DMC (+12.28%) and FGEN (+7.61%). Meanwhile laggard names are were TEL (-17.57%), GLO (-5.15%), and BPI (-4.45%).

Philippine macroeconomic developments in January 2016:

- Inflation slowed to 1.3% in January 2016 compared to 1.5% recorded the previous month. Transportation was lower (+1.5% YoY vs. +2.2%), while the food index was stable (+1.7% YoY vs. +1.7% in Dec). Meanwhile, alcohol and tobacco climbed (+4.7% YoY vs. 4.4%).
- Remittances in November was up 5% in December, translating to 4.6% in 2015. The full year FY15 remittance figure
 was US\$25.8bn, which is ahead of the government's 4% YoY growth target for last year. Remittances from the Middle
 East recorded 23% higher in December.
- Gross International Reserves (GIR) registered US\$80.2 billion in January. The country's GIR was slightly lower from US\$80.67 billion in December. The level is equivalent to 10.2 months' worth of imports and 5.5x short-term external debt based on original maturity (4x on residual maturity). The decline was due attributed to foreign exchange operations and maturing debt obligations.

Fund Performance. The fund fell by 0.32% in February, missing its benchmark by 28 basis points. It underperforms the benchmark on a year-to-date basis by 49 basis points with a return of -2.26%.

Fund Strategy. Market upside to remain capped as foreign selling show no signs of slowing down. Remain tactically underweight in Philippine equities until market volatility tapers off. Hold some cash and take opportunistic strategy in the next few weeks given the wide trading range expected. Stick to liquid, defensive large cap names.

- (c) Primarily medium term tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund.
- (d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
