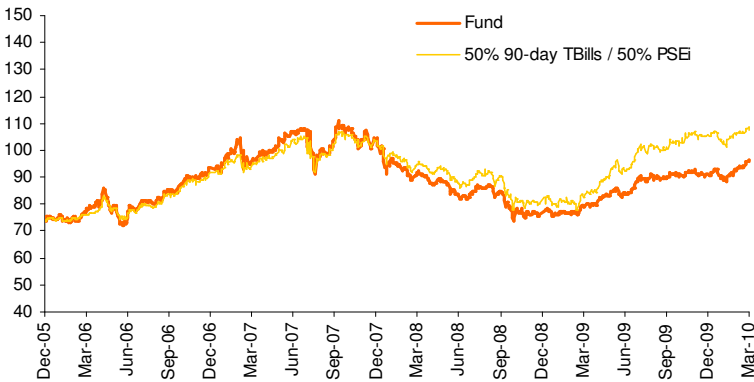

### Fund Manager's Report

Local equities remained upbeat throughout March, extending gains for the 2nd consecutive month. Foreign investors were net buyers for the 5th consecutive month, pushing the PSEi to the 3,161.80 level by March 31, up 3.9% (MoM). Much like it did in the previous month, buying sentiment was spurred by robust FY09 earnings reports as well as positive developments regarding a global recovery. Healthy remittance numbers (January +8.5% yoy) and a moderate inflation rate (January-February 4.2% average) likewise helped support the market further. Top gainers in March were the Property and Conglomerates sectors, advancing 10.2% and 18% respectively. In addition, strong plays in March were infrastructure and power companies, as supply pressures helped curb demand for the likes of Metro Pacific Investments Corp. (+17.0%), Aboitiz Power Corp. (+11.4%) and First Gen Corp. (15.8%).

We expect the market to trade sideways as investors will stay in the sidelines due to the upcoming elections. Concerns of Greece's sovereign risk and the rise of crude oil (+3.3% ytd March 31) could further add on to investor's worries. As such, we remain neutral to slightly underweight in terms of equity position with bias towards utilities and select property names.

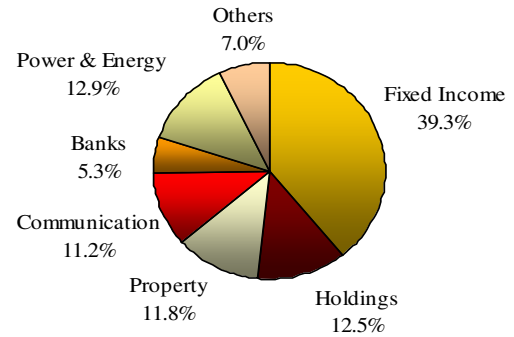
