INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The objective of the fund is to pursue long term capital appreciation by investing in a diversified portfolio of attractively priced stocks with high dividend yields in the Asia Pacific region. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark, the MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex-Japan Total Return Index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest. The Fund is for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon of more than seven (7) years



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. February was positive for Asian equities as oil price rebounded, fears of a Greece exit from Euro dissipated, and major central banks globally continued to be highly accommodative in their monetary policies. Australia was the best performing market driven by the rate cut and more companies lifting dividends. Taiwan outperformed led by strong earnings and guidance from the technology sector. China rose on the back of further monetary easing and market speculations of mergers within the oil and telecom sectors. Hong Kong lagged, again dragged by weak Macau gaming revenue and weak retail sales in HK during Chinese New year. In ASEAN, Indonesian banks and properties rallied on the back of the surprise rate cut. Finally India retreated after a strong January, but still managed to post gains as the government delivered a pro-growth budget.

Fund Performance. The portfolio outperformed this month. Stock selection in Australia was strong. Top contributors include QBE and Macquarie Group which rallied 22% and 17% (In AUD) respectively thanks to strong guidance or earnings. Positions in India also helped as NTPC rose 11% (in INR) driven by anticipation of further infrastructure spending by the government. In Thailand, we initiated a few property names earlier and they performed well due to solid result and rate cut expectation. On the negative side, stock selection in Hong Kong detracted. HSBC continued to be under pressure (-3.7% in HKD) after announcing weak results, as well as from the recent tax evasion allegations. In China, toll road names Zhejiang Expressway consolidated (-3.5% in HKD) after performing strongly in the past few months. Power names also corrected due to fears over tariff cuts.

Fund Strategy. Inflation in Asia has been trending down due to falling global commodity prices, allowing central banks to kick off almost unanimous easing actions. Since August 2014, Korea, Japan, China, India, Singapore, Indonesia, Australia have either cut interest rates, released liquidity in the system or adjusted currency band. We expect monetary easing to continue, resulting in ample liquidity in Asian equities market in 2015. With rates coming off, the "search for yield" is set to continue. Compared to other regions, Asia offer substantial opportunities for yield. Coupled with the various reform program initiated by Asian governments, these positive changes can potentially unlock shareholders' value and lead to a re-rating of certain reform beneficiaries.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Bank Deposits;
- b) Primarily short-term securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government, or by the BSP;
- c) Primarily short-term tradable securities issued or guaranteed by multilateral institutions such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB), International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank;
- d) Primarily short-term tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision of a foreign country or any supranational entity;
- e) Common shares, preferred shares, and convertible preferred shares listed on the Philippine Stock Exchange or any organized stock exchange;
- f) Shares offered in an Initial Public Offering, provided that the company will be listed on the Philippine Stock Exchange or any organized stock exchange within the normal listing period (approximately 30 days from start of the offer period);
- g) Primarily short-term exchange-listed securities and warrants of such securities;
- h) Primarily short-term marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange;
- i) Primarily short-term loans traded in an organized market;
- j) Such other tradable investments outlets/categories as may be approved by the relevant authority and allowed by the BSP; and
- k) Allowable investments denominated in any acceptable foreign currency.
